Action Research is a one-semester international student exchange program in an experiential and situated learning context to acquire interdisciplinary knowledge.

About us

UC Chile was founded in 1888, and it is also one of Chile's oldest universities and one of the most recognized educational institutions in Latin America. The Program

Action Research is a one-semester international student exchange program in an experiential and situated learning context to acquire interdisciplinary knowledge. In this program, students will enroll in two regular courses directly linked to social-focused matters and -at the same time- participate in one of three professional experience alternatives.

Professional Experience Alternatives

The students must choose two courses and one available professional experience related to a track.



RESEARCH INTERNSHIP

The students will develop, support, or complete a research/creation project in a public or private institution.



PRACTICAL LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The student will have the opportunity to face a situation, challenge, or project in a real context, to support its resolution.



VOLUNTEERING

A professional activity where the student participates as a volunteer in an allied organization according to the regular courses developed in the program.

Students Profile

This program is for international undergraduate and master's degree students interested in generating a positive impact on local organizations in Chile in one of these 5 proposed tracks: 1) Work and Society, 2) Health and Diversity, 3) International Cooperation, 4) Design and Communication, 4) Sustainable Development, and 5) Engineering, Innovation, and Technology.

Students must choose two courses from their preferred track and one professional experience

TRACK 1 / WORK AND SOCIETY

This track will allow you to understand the relations between communities and individuals and how they interect in a complex society.

- **1. It will last 2 or 3 months, starting in April and ending in July 2023.
- 2. Practical Learning Experience: it will occur in the Women's Department at the Municipality of Ñuñoa, supporting its work with the community. It will last 2 or 3 months, starting in April and ending in July 2023.

AVAILABLE PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

- 1. AVAILABLE PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Research Internship: it is focused on the Vincula Project, a gathering system between knowledge producers and decision-makers in the legislative field.

This project develops a system of courses to train faculties to achieve a fluid exchange of knowledge with the Chilean Congress as well as identify or generate didactic material on topics related to science, politics, and public policies—also supporting a strategic communication plan designed for universities and the public. It will last 3 to 4 months, starting in April and ending in July 2023.



Application

The application must be through our coordinator Cristián Bonilla. The following documents must be attached to the application email.

- Motivation statement (300 words max), indicating the track and the preferred professional experience. The letter needs to be addressed to the Office of the Vice President for International Affairs at UC | Chile
- Updated resume (in English or Spanish)
- Transcripts of records
- Official Spanish certificate B2 level

Learning Strategy

Faculties and expert professionals will give group lectures, seminars, and workshops in the area. In addition, the students will have complimentary bibliography, the material used by the faculties, and continued support of the Global Mobility team in their independent work.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- Duration: One-semester
- Deadline: December 2022
- Start: March 2022
- **Certificates:** Participants will receive UC Chile transcripts for each course following the successful approval and another certification for participating in the professional experience.
- Language: The program is taught entirely in Spanish.

THE HISTORIC QUARTER OF THE SEAPORT CITY OF VALPARAÍSO

The colonial city of Valparaíso presents an excellent example of late 19th-century urban and architectu¬ral development in Latin America. In its natural am¬phitheater-like setting, the city is characterized by a vernacular urban fabric adapted to the hillsides that are dotted with a great variety of church spires. It contrasts with the geometrical layout utilized in the plain. The city has preserved its interesting early in¬dustrial infrastructures, such as the numerous 'ele¬vators' on the steep hillsides.
