


## Our campuses

# PREPARE YOUR ARRIVAL



#### Migratory information and important documents

#### **Migration process**

Students, professors, or professionals who are planning to engage in any type of exchange program at UC are advised to take note of the following:

- If you will be staying in the country for less than 180 days, you should enter with a Transitory Stay Visa.
- If plan to stay for a period longer than 180 days, you must apply for a Temporary Resident Visa (for Student or Researcher, depending on the case) through the Official Digital Portal of the National Migration Service.

#### **Transitory Stay Visa**

The <u>"Transitory Stay Visa"</u> does not require any prior authorization or processing, unless your country appears on the following <u>list.</u>

The Transitory Stay Visa is valid for a period of 90 days and may be extended for an additional 90 days. <u>As such, students, faculty members, or staff who enter the</u> <u>country using this visa must ensure that they extend their temporary stay before</u> <u>the expiration of the initial 90-day period.</u> The extension process can be completed <u>online</u> during the third month of your stay and carries a fee of USD \$100 or its local equivalent currency.



IMPORTANT/ Individuals holding a Transitory Stay Visa are not permitted to change their immigration status (visa category) while in Chile. Additionally, those who enter the country with this visa category will not be able to open national bank accounts, nor will they be eligible for discount cards for public transportation.

#### **Temporary Resident Visa (for Students)**

Visa applications for foreigners outside Chile must be submitted through the <u>Official Digital Portal of the National Migration Service.</u>

Students, professors, or staff members who plan to stay at the University for longer than 180 days need to apply for a temporary resident visa (for Student or Researcher, depending on the case) before arriving in Chile. This must be requested from your country of origin. Visa approval can take up to four months, so it is recommended that you apply well in advance.

#### **ID Card for Foreigners**

Those entering the country with a temporary resident visa must apply for a Chilean identity card within 30 days of their arrival in the country. All the information can be found <u>here</u>.

#### **Health Insurance**

Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile requires all international students, professors, or professionals on exchange programs to have health insurance before arriving in the country. This insurance must cover the entire duration of the visitor's stay in Chile, including air travel.

The policy must:

- Include the visitor's full name, as it appears on their passport.
- Include the date of coverage and cover the visitor's entire stay in Chile, including air travel.
- Provide at least USD \$30,000 in medical assistance.
- Explicitly cover COVID-19.
- Include health and funeral repatriation services.



**IMPORTANT/** Please ensure that you have your policy number and emergency contact information readily available in case of an emergency and that you know the medical centers and hospitals where your insurance is valid and accepted. <u>Here</u> are some options.

# OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### **National Student Card (TNE)**

Exchange students can apply for the TNE, a benefit granted by the Chilean Government's Ministry of Education, which provides lower fares for metro and bus transportation. This will be processed from Chile, but you have to consider the following:

- You need to have a Temporary Resident Visa and a Chilean Identification Number (RUN).
- It can take two to three months to issue this document, so we recommend that only students whose exchange is for one year apply for it.
- The University will process all the paperwork through our office. It is important that you let us know when you have your RUN.
- You must have a round-trip ticket.
- Students will be asked to provide proof or evidence of financial solvency.

#### **Accommodation**

The University does not offer student housing and does not provide any assistance with finding accommodation for international students. Likewise, it cannot guarantee or be held responsible for the services offered by third parties.

However, we do have a list of accommodation options and related agencies. If you are interested in any of them, you should contact the company or accommodation in question directly.
